

ADMISSION OF RESIDENT STUDENTS

The town of residence of a student is defined in RSA 193:12-II.

New Resident students:

All existing and new resident students, accompanied by parent/guardian, should register at school before opening day or as soon as possible upon taking up residency within the School District.

Children entering school for the first time must have proof of a recent (within the last year) physical examination, and immunization records, and the school must receive a copy of the child's birth certificate. Proof of residency must be shown for the following groups of students:

1. All kindergarten and newly registered first grade children
2. All new registrations to the School District – this will include students who have recently moved into the District from other communities.

Parents must provide two of the following as proof of residence:

1. Utility bill or deposit receipt indicating address
2. Purchase and Sales Agreement
3. Driver's License
4. Lease Agreement
5. Voter Registration
6. Social Services Papers – Social Security, AFDC
7. Rent Receipt including verification of landlord's address and phone number
8. Welfare card

In the unusual case that these are not available, a signed and notarized statement of residence must be submitted.

The School Board considers illegal attendance by non-residents to be theft of services from the New Boston School District and directs the Superintendent to inform the appropriate Law Enforcement Agency.

Children who register for school after the beginning of the school year will be allowed to register and be given a ten-day grace period to produce proof of residence.
